"Details of syllabus for <u>BA (Hons.) in Modern European Languages, Literatures and Cultures</u> (<u>French/German/Italian/Russian</u>) under the Centre for Modern European Languages, Literatures and Cultural Studies (CMELLCS)

Note:

- Papers I, II, VII and VIII will be in the language of specialization, i.e. the students can opt for specialization in any one of the four languages currently being offered (French, German, Italian or Russian).
- Papers III, IV, V and VI will be *common papers*, i.e. all Honours students of CMELLCS will have to take these courses.
- In accordance with Visva-Bharati regulations and/or UGC guidelines, all students of CMELLCS will have to take *General and Subsidiary* (related subjects) courses for the stipulated period and duration.
- Students will answer examinations in Papers I and II in the language of specialization only.
- Students will answer all examinations in Papers III, IV, V and VII in English.
- Students will answer part of the examinations in Paper VI (translation from English into the language of specialization) in the language of specialization, and the remaining part (Theories of Translation) in English.
- Students will answer Paper VIII in the language of specialization only.
- *Specialized Study of the Language means a student can opt for "Specialized Study of French" or "Specialized Study of German" or "Specialized Study of Italian" or "Specialized Study of Russian".

The eligibility criteria for admission to the course are 60% in aggregate in Higher Secondary or equivalent and 60% in English. Students do not require any prior knowledge in French/German/Italian/Russian as these languages will be taught from the zero level.

At the end of the third year students will be awarded the degree of <u>BA (Honours) in Modern European Languages, Literatures and Cultures (French/German/Italian/Russian)</u> as per their specialization in the language and culture of their choice.
