Centre for Journalism & Mass Communication was established in 2000 by Visva-Bharati. It became a constituent Centre incorporated in Visva-Bharati Act in 2005. Currently it runs one MA in Communication & Journalism programme with 22 courses and a Doctoral Programme (with three course Course –work and Doctoral Thesis writing). During last few years, it conducted three value-added courses in Film making, Audio-visual Skill development and Research. The Department offers specializations with research thrust. Two <u>International Conference and Workshop were organizedin Pre-covid past</u>.

The department attracts doctoral scholars and Master's students from countries like China, Thailand and Bangladesh. It runs a regular print and cyber media student practical newspaper Visva-Bharati Chronicle and visva-bharatichronicle.org. It runs summer internships for students in collaboration with Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore Foundation, People's Archive of India etc. Presently three international collaborations are in process- one with Panteion University Greece in Erasmus-Mundus programme, another with Rajhshahi University Bangladesh and the last a multinational research network.
