Formation of Scholars Club: As per the guideline of the NAAC, the SCHOLARS' CLUB of Visva-Bharati has been formed with the Research scholars of Visva-Bharati. It was formed by Dr Nimai Chand Saha, Librarian, Visva-Bharati, in a meeting of the scholars with the library authority at the Conference Hall, Central Library, dated 9th April 2025 at 5.00 pm. In this meeting, Dr Saha explained the objectives of the formation of the Scholars' Club, and then, based on the willingness of the Scholars, their name were included as members of the Scholars' Club.

Objectives of the Scholars' Club: The objective of the formation of the scholar club is to promote the research activity as a binary system. They will also help the library authority with any problems/issues relating to the library service, facilities, and resources.
