### **About the Seminar**

Rabindranath Tagore honored Gautama Buddha as *Mahāmanab* (the Great Man) and considered his teachings invaluable for peaceful sustenance and progressive statehood. Since its inception in the 5th–4th century BCE, Buddhism has upheld *karuṇā* (compassion), *mettā* (loving-kindness), and *ahiṃsā* (non-violence) as central ethical values. These ideals have transcended boundaries, shaping cultures across Asia and beyond.

In today's context of armed conflicts, refugee crises, ecological challenges, and digital-age dilemmas, the Buddhist emphasis on cultivating inner peace as the foundation for social harmony offers a profound path toward coexistence. This international seminar seeks to bring together scholars, monastics, peace practitioners, and policymakers to deliberate on the philosophical, ethical, and practical relevance of Buddhist principles in contemporary peace building.

## **Themes & Sub-Themes**

## **Main Theme:**

From Compassion to Coexistence: Buddhist Perspectives on World Peace

## **Sub-Themes (Indicative, not exhaustive):**

• **Doctrinal and Ethical Foundations** – Compassion (*karuṇā*), Loving-kindness (*mettā*), Equanimity (*upekkhā*), and the Middle Path as peace frameworks.

- **Buddhist Peacebuilding in Practice** Diplomacy, mediation, post-conflict rehabilitation, humanitarian work.
- **Mind, Education, and Social Harmony** Peace education, mindfulness-based practices, mental health and harmony.
- **Ecology, Sustainability, and Peace** Buddhist ecological ethics, interdependence, climate change responses.
- **Gender and Peace in Buddhism** Women monastics, gender equality, inclusivity in Buddhist traditions.
- **Buddhism in the Digital Age** Cyber ethics, countering extremism, fostering compassion online.

## **Submission Guidelines**

- **Abstract:** 300–350 words, including title, author's name, affiliation, and contact details.
- Full Paper: 4000–6000 words, Times New Roman, 12 pt, 1.5 spacing, in MS Word/PDF format.
- Papers may be presented in **English**, **Hindi**, **Sanskrit**, **Pali or Bengali** (with abstract in English).
- Selected papers will be published in a **peer-reviewed edited volume**.
