

THE VISVA-BHARATI ACT, 1951

(NO. XXIX OF 1951)

An Act to declare the institution known as Visva-Bharati to be an Institution of National Importance and to provide for its functioning as a Unitary, teaching and residential university.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES TO Ph.D. PROGRAMME: 2025-26

As per University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Ph.D. Programme) Regulations, 2022 issued through THE GAZETTE OF INDIA: EXTRAORDINARY, NEW DELHI, THE 7TH NOVEMBER, 2022 followed by Notification No.F.4-1(UGC-NET Review Committee/2024 (NET)/14068, dated 27th March, 2024

1. The following are minimum criteria to seek admission to the Ph.D. programme: -

I. Candidates who have completed: -

A 1-year/2-semester master's degree programme after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme or a 2-year/4-semester master's degree programme after a 3-year bachelor's degree programme or qualifications declared equivalent to the master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed

Or

Equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of the educational institution.

The subject (/allied subjects) in master's degree required for admission to a Ph.D. programme shall be decided by the concerned department. In case of admission to Ph.D. in the department of Indo-Tibetan, the candidate should have at least one paper of 100 marks in Indo-Tibetan Studies at Postgraduate level.

A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled category as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme should have a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade on a point scale wherever the grading system is followed. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled category as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.

2. Duration of the Ph.D. Programme:

- I. Ph.D. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years, including course work, and a maximum duration of six (6) years from the date of admission to the Ph.D. programme.
- II. A maximum of additional two (2) years can be given through a process of re-registration as per the Statute/Ordinance of the Visva-Bharati; provided, however, that the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme should not exceed eight (8) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.
 - Provided further that, female Ph.D. scholars and Persons with Disabilities (having more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two (2) years; however, the total period for completion of a Ph.D. programme in such cases should not exceed ten (10) years from the date of admission in the Ph.D. programme.
- III. Female Ph.D. Scholars may be provided Maternity Leave/Child Care Leave for up to 240 days in the entire duration of the Ph.D. programme.

3. Procedure for Ph.D. admission:

The University Grants Commission (UGC), vide its notification dated 27th March, 2024 has decided

that from the Academic Session 2024-25, the score of the National Eligibility Test (NET) conducted by UGC score can be used for admission to Ph.D. programmes in place of entrance tests conducted by the different Universities/HEIs.

Accordingly, in place of entrance test, Visva-Bharati has decided to use National Eligibility Test (NET) scores for admission to Ph.D. programmes from the academic session 2025-26 except the cases mentioned in sl. no. IV&VI.

Based on the scores obtained in NET, the candidates will be eligible in three categories (As per the notification of UGC dated 27th March, 2024):

- I. Admission under UGC-NET/UGC CSIR NET- JRF category (including category 1) will be taken as per the Notification No.F.4-1(UGC-NET Review Committee/2024 (NET)/14068, dated 27th March, 2024), where 100% weightage will be assigned to viva-voce/Interview. The validity of JRF will be counted as mentioned in the JRF Award letter.
- II. For students who qualify in UGC-NET/UGC CSIR NET under categories 2 and 3, 70% weightage will be given for test scores and 30% weightage for the interview for admission to Ph.D. programmes. The Ph.D. admission will be based on the combined merit of NET marks and the marks obtained in the interview/viva-voce.
- III. The validity of UGC-NET/UGC-CSIR NET certificates (Categories 2 and 3) will be considered until the closing date of application.
- IV. Candidates who qualify for fellowship/ Scholarship in GATE/CEED/ICAR-AICE-JRF/SRF (Ph.D.) and other similar national level tests will be eligible for Ph.D. admission at Visva-Bharati based on an interview with 100% weightage. Candidates without fellowships will be assessed in the same manner as NET-qualified candidates under category 2 and 3. However, for assessing under category 2 and 3, the score/certificate of GATE/CEED should be issued within one year prior to the closing date of application. For ICAR-AICE-JRF/SRF (Ph.D.) only the valid score in the current academic session will be considered. For admission to Ph.D. in the department of Agricultural Engineering, the applicant should have a valid GATE score.
- V. UGC-NET/UGC CSIR NET or other qualifying certificate being in a particular subject/ allied subject area for admission to a Ph.D. programme will be decided by the concerned department.
- VI. Visva-Bharati will conduct the entrance test for those Ph.D. Programs where NET is not conducted by UGC/CSIR/ICAR. The admission test will be conducted for admission in Ph.D. programs such as Rural Studies, Rural Management, Italian and Design (Silpa Sadana) as NET is not conducted by UGC for the respective subjects with the incorporation of the following points:

- a) In above mentioned subjects, Visva-Bharati may admit students through an Entrance Test. The Entrance Test syllabus shall consist of 50% of research methodology and 50% shall be subject specific.
- b) Students who have secured 50 % marks in the entrance test are eligible to be called for the interview.
- c) A relaxation of 5 % marks will be allowed in the entrance examination for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/differently-abled category as per the decision of the Commission (Government of India) from time to time.
- d) Provided that for the selection of candidates based on the entrance test conducted by the Visva-Bharati, a weightage of 70 % for the entrance test and 30 % for the performance in the interview/viva-voce shall be given.
- VII. Visva-Bharati may decide the number of eligible students to be called for an interview based on the number of Ph.D. seats available.

4. Date of Entrance Test and/or Interview:

The date of Entrance test/interview will be finalized by the concerned Department. Date, time and venue will be notified in the University Admission Portal- www.vbadmission.in .

5. Venue of Entrance Test and/or Interview:

Respective Department / Centre of Each Bhavana / Vibhaga (Institute) or as otherwise notified.

6. Reservation Guidelines:

- I. Reservation of seats for OBC, SC, ST, EWS and Differently abled candidates (OBC Non creamy layer -27%, SC -15%, ST -7.5%, EWS -10%, PWD -5%) will be made as per the rules of the Government of India.
- II. Category Certificates (OBC Non-Creamy layer/SC/ST/EWS/PWD), issued by competent authority. Validity period of OBC Certificate is three (03) years (If the OBC certificate is older than (03) three years, current year OBC Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) issued by S.D.O or Equivalent officials is mandatory, for EWS it is current year and PWD certificate validity as mentioned in the certificate. No request for further timing will be entertained.
- 7. Incomplete applications are liable to be summarily rejected. Rights of cancellation or admission lie with the Admission Committee of the Bhavanas / Vibhaga (Institute) concerned. The University reserves the right to restrict the number of eligible applicants to be called for admission test/interview.

8. Admission of International students in Ph.D. programme:

Each supervisor can guide up to two international research scholars on a supernumerary basis over and above the permitted number of Ph.D. scholars as specified in Visva-Bharati Ph.D. ordinance clause 6.3. (An eligible Professor can guide up to 8, an associate professor can guide up to 6 and an assistant professor can guide up to 4 Ph.D. scholars, respectively, at any given time.)

Admission test (Entrance/Interview) will be conducted by the concerned Department/Bhavana for admission of foreign students in the Ph.D. programme at Visva-Bharati.

9. Ph.D. through Part-time Mode-

I. Ph.D. programmes through part-time mode will be permitted, provided all the conditions stipulated in these Regulations (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Ph.D. Programme, Regulations, 2022) are fulfilled.

- II. Visva-Bharati shall obtain a "No Objection Certificate" through the candidate for a part-time Ph.D. programme from the appropriate authority in the organization where the candidate is employed, clearly stating that:
 - a) The candidate is permitted to pursue studies on a part-time basis.
 - b) His/her official duties permit him/her to devote sufficient time for research.
 - c) If required, he/she will be relieved from the duty to complete the course work.
- **10.** Applicants are advised to visit our website for any update (inclusion/omission) in connection with the admission test/interview at regular intervals.

- 12. Online Application Procedure: Candidates have to apply through our online application system (visvabharatiadmission.samarth.edu.in). Details of the courses, eligibility criteria and relevant information are available in the University Admission Portal- www.vbadmission.in
- 13. It is mandatory to submit the Score card of the tests mentioned in section-3 of the prospectus while filling the application form.

The application fee in case of an online application may be paid by the following way:

Candidate can make the payment Online using any of the online payment methods of Net Banking, Debit Card and Credit Card. Candidates would get INSTANT confirmation of their payments and submissions when they pay through online payment methods as listed. The application fee is non-refundable.

International students will be communicated over e-mail after filling up of form for completion of payment.

No Cash payment will be allowed.

Candidates are advised to visit our website: **www.visvabharati.ac.in** as well admission portal: **www.vbadmission.in** at regular intervals for updates.

Note: Visva-Bharati remains closed on Saturday and Sundays, Rabindra Bhavana (Wednesday and Thursday) and Patha-Bhavana (Wednesday and Sunday). However, all the Bhavanas (Institutes)/Administrative offices work from 9.30 am to 6.00 pm.
