Course Name: JPHDCW-1

Course Title: Research Methodology and Techniques

Course Contents: Concept of research.

Importance of theories and facts. Identification of research problems. Objective, formulation of hypothesis.

Sources of information – Primary and secondary sources.

Research Method: Experimental, Descriptive, Historical, Analytical, Survey,

Normative.

Tools of Research – Questionnaire, Check List, Sample and Sampling. Analysis of Data – Computation, Logical analysis, Descriptive analysis,

Statistical analysis.

Writing Research Report.

Computer Applications (Basic knowledge of computer applications).

the students' requirements.

Course Name: JPHDCW-2
Course Title: Elective Course

Course Contents: The students are expected to choose <u>any four</u> of the following themes and

follow a guided research.

a. Japanese language and linguistics

b. Japanese Literature – Modern, Post-modern, Contemporary (theories, movements, trends)

- c. Writers and their works Modern, Post-modern, Contemporary (*Shi, geki, shousetu, nikki, monogatari, zuihitsu*)
- d. Aspects of Japanese society Religion and beliefs
- e. Culture of Japan (Traditional, modern, pop culture etc.)
- f. Performing and fine arts of Japan
- g. Folk culture and folklore in Japan
- h. Japanese Society (Education system, Gender, work culture etc.)
- i. Events of significance in Japanese history

Course Name: JPHDCW-3

Course Title: Review of published research work and presentation of a synopsis on the

proposed area/ title of research

Course Contents: Report on the review of research studies related to the identified research topic.

(Including viva-voce) choice based.

To be written under the guidance and supervision of a faculty member.

Examination guideline of Course- work

• An 'End Test' will be conducted at the end of the Course Work as per University Examination rules. The full marks for Paper I and II will be 100 each, of which 20 marks will be for Internal Assessment and 80 for end-course exam.

- Mode of evaluation for Paper III will be as follows:
 - The candidate will submit a review of research studies related to his/her topic duly guided by a faculty member and also make a power point presentation in the presence of faculty members of the Department.
- A scholar has to obtain 50 out of 100 marks in each paper separately for qualifying in the Course Work.
- On successful completion of the course work, a synopsis of the proposed study will be submitted by the candidate and a presentation of the same will be made before the Board of Studies of the concerned department for recommendation of the theme/title of Research and assigning of a Supervisor.
