

A PROFILE



Genesis

Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore's vision of rural reconstruction was rooted in a scientific understanding of village life through systematic surveys and data collection. To translate this vision into practice, the Sriniketan Experiment was launched in 1922–23 under the supervision of British Philanthropist and Agronomist L.K. Elmhirst. Its objectives were to identify the problems of Indian villages, seek practical solutions, and work towards making them self-reliant and prosperous. The aim was to improve the economic condition and well-being of the rural population. The Sriniketan activities were organized under three broad branches: (i) Research and Experiments, (ii) Training, and (iii) Extension and Development. Later, in 1954, the Agro-Economic Research Centre (AERC) was established at Visva-Bharati with the support of the Government of India,



absorbing the projects under the Sriniketan Experiment. The Centre became permanent in May 1990 and was integrated with Visva-Bharati in April 1995. It is funded by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Government of India. Initially, this Centre was established as Agro-Economic Research Centre for Eastern India, covering Assam, Bihar, Orissa, and West Bengal. It was set up in line with Visva-Bharati's tradition of rural reconstruction initiated by Tagore at Sriniketan. At present, its jurisdiction covers West Bengal, Sikkim, and the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The Centre's existing building was constructed with

capital grants sanctioned by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture in 1957–58. The building, with a plinth area of 6,970 square feet, was designed by Sri A. C. Bose, Engineer-in-Charge of Visva-Bharati's Works and Building Department. The sculpture in front of the building was created by Sri Suren Dey of Kala Bhavana, under the guidance of the renowned artist Sri Ramkinkar Baij.

Symposium & Special Lecture by Dr. P.K. Joshi







AERC in Visva-Bharati- World's First Living Heritage University

Visva-Bharati founded by Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore in 1921 at Santiniketan, West Bengal, is a place "where the world makes a home in a single nest." The university blends Indian traditions with global cultural exchange and promotes harmony between nature, learning, and creativity. As Gurudeva noted, Santiniketan is the land of peace and Sriniketan is the land of prosperity, and these are the twin campuses of the University. Visva-Bharati was declared a Central University and an Institution of National Importance by an Act of Parliament in 1951. The President of India is the Paridarsaka (Visitor) of the University, the Governor of West Bengal is the Pradhana (Rector), and the Prime Minister of India acts as the Acharya (Chancellor). The President of India appoints the *Upacharya* (Vice-Chancellor) of the University. The institution is renowned for its emphasis on holistic learning, artistic expression, rural reconstruction, and international collaboration. In recognition of its unique cultural and educational heritage, Santiniketan, the campus, is declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2023, acknowledging its outstanding universal value as a living centre of learning, creativity, and cultural dialogue.

The Agro-Economic Research Centre, since its establishment in 1954, embodies Gurudeva's vision of linking knowledge with rural well-being. As one of the oldest centres of its kind in the country, AERC has been engaged in pioneering research on agriculture, rural economy, farmers' welfare, and agrarian institutions. It has contributed significantly to policy formulation at both state and national levels by providing evidence-based insights into issues of agricultural development, rural livelihoods, and sustainability. The Centre continues to carry forward the Sriniketan legacy of rural reconstruction and integrated development, making Visva-Bharati not only a cultural and educational heritage hub but also a knowledge institution serving grassroots economic transformation.
