Specific Bye-laws for the
AJOY GHOSH MEMORIAL TROPHY TOURNAMENT: 2024-2025.

1. The above Tournament shall be played according to the relevant Administrative Rules and the General Bye-laws of the Association for the year 2024-25 and Specific Bye-Laws mentioned hereunder :
2. White SG TEST (LE) Ball, Colored Dress and Black Sight Screen to be used in all the Matches of the Tournament.
3. The Tournament shall be known as '*AJOY GHOSH MEMORIAL TROPHY TOURNAMENT*' and will be played on League cum Knock-out basis.
4. The Tournament is open only to the affiliated Universities of this Association. Male players of the respective Universities will be eligible to participate in the Tournament. The players willing to participate in the Tournament shall have to be registered with this Association. Total 8 Universities will be divided into 2 Groups on the basis of ranking on the performances of the last year's Tournament. After completion of the First Stage which will be played on League basis, the Top two ranked Team of each of the Groups will be eligible to play the Semi Final Match. Team A1 will play with B2 and Team B1 will play with A2 in the Semifinal. Two winners of Semifinal match will play in the finals to decide 'Champion' and 'Runner Up'.
5. There will be no Entry Fee for the Tournament.
6. The Schedule of the Tournament including the Fixtures shall be strictly adhered to and no postponement of the Matches will be allowed except under unavoidable circumstances. Teams not playing according to the Fixtures will be deemed to have conceded defeat in the Match.
7. (a) The Captains of both the Teams shall exchange their respective Players' List (total 15 players including the 4 nominated Substitutes), signed by the Captain, just before the Toss in presence of the Observer and or Umpire/s, not earlier than 30 minutes and not later than 15 minutes before the scheduled or rescheduled time of start of the match.
(b) If a Team intends to complain about the eligibility of a player/s of its opponent, the onus of proving lies with the protesting team within 1 hours after completion of the Match at the venue for necessary action by the Association. The College Sub-Committee for their authorized person/s posted at the venue will take suitable action as is deemed necessary on receipt of the documents and the protest. The protest not lodged within time limit as specified above shall be deemed to have failed.
(c) The Eligibility of Players of the University will be on the basis of Photo Identity Cards of **16 players** as registered through Eligibility Proforma supplied by this Association duly filled in and signed by the Registrar/Sports Officer/Sports Director/Head of the Department of Sports of the concerned University which should be submitted to the Observer appointed by this Association at the Staging Centre well before the commencement of the Tournament.
(d) The Eligibility of Players of the Universities for participation in the Tournament would be valid on submission of the following documents attested by the Registrar/Secretary, Sports Board/Sports Officer/Head of the Department of Sports of the concerned University –

- Xerox copy of Admit Card of Madhyamik Exam. & Mark-Sheet of H.S. Exam. or equivalent,
 - Xerox copy of the Fees Book/Money Receipt for Admission in the present Course or Mark-sheet of the last year.
 - Students admitted under Distance Mode Course are not eligible for participation.
 - In addition to the above, the eligibility rule of AIU conducted Inter University Sports Competition would be followed.
 - The players must show their Aadhar /Voter I.D. Cards in original for verification of their identity.
- (e) The Team will consist of 16 players, 1 Coach and 1 Manager.

8. Facilities :

- (i) Second Class Rly. Fare or Actual Bus fare on both ways journey will be provided by the Association.
- (ii) Arrangement for board & lodging will be provided by this Association from one night before the commencement of their first match.
- (iii) Gears shall have to be arranged by the participating teams.
- (iv) Match Balls will be provided by this Association.

9. Hours of Play and duration of Interval (in all the Matches):-

- (a) 09-00 A.M. To 12-30 P.M. (First Session)
12-30 P.M. To 01-15 P.M. (LUNCH)
01-15 P.M. To 04-45 P.M. (Second Session)

However, the above time schedule may be altered by The Tour, Fixture & Technical Committee, if required, with prior intimation to the participating Teams.

- (b) If an innings is completed within 30 minutes of the scheduled time for the Lunch Interval, the Interval shall be taken immediately (to include 10m interval between the Innings).
- (c) If the team batting first is all-out when more than 30 minutes remain before the scheduled close of 1st session then the innings of the batting second shall start after 10 minutes interval between the innings. Interval for Lunch shall be taken at the scheduled time.
- (d) Declaration of a side's innings is not permitted.
- (e) In every match 1 New White Ball from each end to be used by the Fielding Team, that is 2 New White Balls to be used by the Fielding Team in every match.

However if a match is reduced to 25 overs or less per side before the first innings of the match commences, each team shall have only 1 new Ball for its Innings.

10. Length of Innings (First and Second Phase):-

(a) In an uninterrupted match :

- (i) Each team shall bat for 50 overs within 3 hours and 30 Minutes unless all-out earlier.
(Total 210 minutes is allotted to each fielding side which includes Drinks, Medical attention, Changing of Ball, Ball retrieval, insufficient time for rolling etc.)
- (ii) If the team batting first is dismissed in less than 50 overs, then the team batting second shall be entitled to bat for 50 overs.

(b) In an interrupted matches where the start is delayed or where play is suspended due to ground or weather condition before or after commencement of FIRST innings :-

The object should always be to re-fix the number of overs so that both the teams have the opportunity of batting for the same number of overs (minimum full 20 overs) in the allotted time.

The calculation of number of overs to be bowled shall be based on one over for each 4.20 minutes in the time remaining before the close of play at 4.45 p.m.

After calculation if it yields ODD NUMBER, then one more over to be added to the total number of overs and then the same is to be equally divided to both the teams and in that case, the match may finish late, as to be decided by the Umpires.

When the calculation produces EVEN NUMBER, then the fraction of an over, if any, is to be ignored and the total overs would be equally allotted to both the teams and in that case, the match may finish early, as to be decided by the Umpires. The lunch Interval shall commence accordingly at the time which shall be decided by the Umpires.

All calculation shall be based on 4.20 minutes for one over in the remaining time before the close of play at 4.45 p.m., in line with the procedure mentioned in Clause 10(b) hereinabove.

11. Late start of play and Penalty:

- (a) If one of the competing team turns up late, or defaults on any other reason, play may commence at any time between 9-00 a.m. and 9-30 a.m. In that event, the defaulting side shall bat for less than 50 overs. Calculation of overs is to be made as provided hereunder:
 - i. Time lost in starting the match shall be deducted from the allotted time of the innings of the defaulting side to get the remaining playing time of their innings.
 - ii. Remaining playing time would be divided by 4.20 minutes to get the number of overs.
 - iii. Fraction of an over would be ignored.
 - iv. If the defaulting side fields, its opponent Team shall be entitled to bat for 50 overs for 210 minutes, whichever is sooner, unless the team is all out earlier.
- (b) If both teams turn up late, play may commence at any time between 9-00 a.m. and 9-30 a.m. and in that event, the umpires will allot the equal number of overs to both the teams taking into account of total remaining playing time divided by 4.20 minutes. Same principle as mentioned in Clause 10(b) hereinabove shall apply.

12. Penalty for failing to bowl scheduled number of overs:-

Law-17 (e) of General Bye Laws of the Association shall apply.

13. Number of overs per Bowler:

No bowler shall bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs in an uninterrupted innings. In a delayed or interrupted match where the total overs are reduced for both the teams or for the team bowling second, no bowler shall be allowed to bowl more than one-fifth of the allotted overs. However, where the total overs is not divisible by 5, one additional over shall be allowed to the maximum number per bowler necessary to make up the balance.

Example –A : Due to interruption the match is reduced to 40 overs to each side.
5 Bowlers can bowl maximum 8 overs each.

Example –B :- Due to rain match is reduced to 34 overs to each side.
4 bowlers can bowl maximum 7 overs and one bowler would be permitted to bowl maximum 6 overs.

In the event of a bowler is suspended or breaking down during an over and unable to complete the over, the remaining ball (s) of the over shall be bowled by any other bowler who has not bowled the previous over and shall not bowl next over or part thereof. Such part of an over shall count as a full over for both the bowlers so far as bowler's limitation is concerned.

14. Free Hit for No Ball:

The delivery following a "No-ball" shall be a "Free Hit" for which ever batsman is facing it. If the delivery for a "Free Hit" is not a legitimate delivery ("No-ball" or "Wide Ball"), then the next delivery shall also be a "Free Hit".

Changing of field placement and position of fielders are not permitted for the "Free Hit" delivery unless there is a change of striker. But if "No-ball" is called for contravention of Field Restriction or Limitation of on-side fielders, minimum possible adjustment shall be allowed.

The Bowler's end umpire shall signal "No-ball" to the scorer and then signal a "Free Hit" by extending one arm straight upwards and moving it in a circular motion.

In case of "Free Hit" delivery, the batsman can only be dismissed under Law -21 ("No-ball").

15. Field Restriction :

Two semi circles shall be drawn on the field of play. The Semi Circles shall have as their centre the Middle stump at either side of the pitch. The radius of each of the Semi Circles shall be 25 yards. The Semi Circles shall be linked by Two parallel straight lines drawn on the field.

The Field restriction area should be marked by continuous painted white lines or dots at 5 yards interval.

At the instant of delivery :

Powerplay-1 : No more than two (2) fielders shall be permitted outside this field restriction area. In an innings of 50 overs, these are 1 to 10 inclusive.

Powerplay-2 : No more than four (4) fielders shall be permitted outside this field restriction area. In an innings of 50 overs these are 11 to 40 inclusive.

Powerplay-3 : No more than five (5) fielders shall be permitted outside this field restriction area. In an innings of 50 overs, these are overs 41 to 50 inclusive.

In circumstance when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of overs within each phase of the innings shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd Innings of the match.

If play is interrupted during an innings and the table above applies, the Power play takes immediate effect. For the avoidance of doubt this applies even if the interruption has occurred mid-over.

Illustrations :

A 50 over innings is interrupted after 8.3 overs and reduced to 32 overs. The new phases are 7+19+6. Therefore the middle phase fielding restriction (Powerplay-2) take immediate effect when play resumes and last for further 17.3 overs. The final phase (Powerplay-3) begins after 26 overs have been bowled.

A 40 over innings is interrupted after 18.5 and reduced to 22 overs. The new phases are 5+13+4. When play resumes, the final phase fielding restrictions (Powerplay-3) apply for the remaining 3.1 overs.

At the commencement of the second and third Powerplay overs of an innings, the umpire shall signal such commencement to the scorers by rotating his arm in a large circle.

In the event of an infringement of "Field Restrictions", the Striker's-end umpire shall call and signal "No Ball".

16. Wide Bowling —Judging a Wide

Law 22 of General Bye Laws shall apply.

17. The Points :

(i) In the League Stage, the points to be earned by the Team would be as under :—

1. Win / Match Awarded	4 Points
2. Tie / Drawn	2 Points each
3. Match Lost	0 Points

(ii) In the event of points of two or more Teams within a Group are equal, after the League stage, the following shall apply to determine the Group position and the Team who shall qualify to play the Final.

1. Team with more number of wins.
2. The Winner of the match against each other (winner of head to head), this is only applicable if the points and number of wins of only two teams are equal.
3. If not applicable, then the Team with the higher Net Run Rate.
4. If still can't be separated, then Draw of lots.

(iii) Net Run Rate :

- * Average run per over scored throughout the competition against the team is to be deducted from the average run per over scored by the Team throughout the competition.
- * If the Team is all-out before their full quota of overs, the calculation shall be based on their full quota of overs for which they were entitled to.
- * Only those matches where result has been achieved shall be taken into account for Net Run Rate calculation.

18. Saliva Penalty :

Apply of Saliva or spitting on the match-ball is a strict no-no and a punishable offence. Anyone found violating this special protocol by the Umpires or Observer, there shall be an award of five (5) Penalty Runs to the Batting Side.

Polishing the Ball on the clothing is allowed provided that no artificial substance or Saliva is used, that the only natural substance used is Sweat and that such polishing wastes no time.

19. The Result :

(a) A result can be achieved only if both the teams have had the opportunity of batting for at least full 20 overs, unless one team has been all out in less than 20 overs or unless the team batting second scores enough runs to win the match in less than 20 overs.

(b) In a match in which both the teams have had the opportunity of batting for 50 overs in an uninterrupted match or lesser number of overs in an interrupted match (minimum full 20 overs), the team scoring the higher number of runs shall be the Winner.

If the scores are equal, the team which has lost lesser number of wickets shall be the Winner.

(i) If the match could not be started due to ground or weather conditions, then the match shall be treated as Drawn

(ii) If one or both the Teams did not get the opportunity to play for a minimum of full 20 overs, the match shall be treated as Drawn.

(iii) If the scores and the wickets lost by both the teams are equal, in that case the match shall be treated as "Tie".

(iv) If the match could not be started or is abandoned after commencement and could not be played to finish (minimum full 20 overs) due to reason other than the ground or weather conditions, the fate of the match shall be decided by the Senior Tournament Committee.

In the Final match, in the event of the score and the fall of wicket of both the teams are equal, the winner shall be decided on the result of "Super Over" as per Appendix-B of the General Bye-laws of the Association. However, if the weather or ground conditions do not provide the scope for a "Super Over", then both the Finalist Teams shall be declared as Joint Winners.

(c) Matches when Second innings is interrupted – Calculation of "Target Score"

If, due to suspension of play, the number of overs in the innings of the team batting second had to be revised to a lesser number of overs (minimum of full 20 overs) than that allotted to the team batting first, their Target Score, which they must exceed to win the match, shall be calculated by multiplying the revised number of overs by the average runs per over scored by the team batting first throughout their innings and adding one run with it. If the Target Score involves a fraction of a run, it shall be considered as one run.

(e) If a match is abandoned before the team batting second have played their allotted number of overs (minimum of full 20 overs) and they have neither been all out, nor have passed their opponents score, the result shall be decided on the average run-rate throughout the innings of both the teams.

The Team having higher run-rate shall be the Winner. A part of an over bowled, shall be treated as full over.

(f) In the event of the team batting first is all out in less than their full quota of overs, the calculation of the average run-rate shall be based on the full quota of overs to which they were entitled to.

20. Allowable Short Pitch deliveries per over :-

A bowler shall be limited to two fast short pitch deliveries per over. A fast short pitched delivery is defined as a ball, which passes or would have passed above the shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease. The umpire at the bowler's end shall advise the bowler and the batsman on strike, when each fast short pitched delivery has been bowled.

In addition, a ball that passes above head height of the batsman, standing upright at the popping crease, that prevents him from being able to hit it with his bat by means of a normal cricket stroke shall be called a Wide.

For the avoidance of doubt any fast short pitched delivery that is called a Wide, for reason mentioned in above point, shall also count as one of the allowable short pitched deliveries in that over.

In the event of a bowler bowling more than two short pitched delivery in an over, the bowler's end umpire shall call & signal "No Ball" on each such occasion. After the bowler's end umpire has called & signaled "No Ball", he shall signal "No ball" to the scorers and then tap the head with the other hand.

If a bowler delivers a third fast short pitched ball in an over, the umpire, after the call of No-ball and when the ball is dead, shall caution the bowler, inform the other umpire, the captain of the fielding side and the batsmen at the wicket of what has occurred.

This caution shall apply throughout the innings.

If there is a second instance of the bowler being No-balled in the innings for bowling more than two fast short pitched deliveries in an over, the umpire shall advise the bowler that this is his final warning for the innings.

Should there be any further instance by the same bowler in that innings, the umpire shall:

- call and signal No ball
- When the ball is dead, direct the captain of the fielding side to suspend the bowler immediately from bowling.
- inform the other umpire for the reason for this action.

The bowler thus suspended shall not be allowed to bowl again in that innings.

21. COVERING THE PITCH

- Before the match:-

The use of covers before the match is the responsibility of the Ground Authority and may include full covering if required. The pitch shall be entirely protected against rain up to the commencement of play. However, the Ground Authority shall grant suitable Facility to the captains to inspect the Pitch before the nomination of their players and to The umpires to discharge their duties as required.

- During the match:-

The pitch shall be entirely protected against rain up to the commencement of play, and for the duration of the period of the match. The covers must totally protect the pitch and also the pitch surroundings, to a minimum of 5 meters either side of the pitch, and any worn or soft areas in the outfield. The bowler's run-ups shall be covered during inclement weather, in order to keep them dry, to a distance of at least 10 x 10 meters.
