Name of the Course is- 2-Years Certificate Course in Textile Design.

Duration of the course and subjects of study:

The certificate course shall be of two years duration.

Course is not transferable to course of study in Kala-Bhavana.

Subjects of study:

The 2-Years certificate course in Design will comprise of 5 units in each year as given below:-

Subjects to be taught: 2-Years Certificate Course in Textile Design.

1st Year: All 5 subjects are compulsory subjects for 1st year.

Each subject will be evaluated in 100 marks. Total 500 marks.

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2nd Year: All 5 subjects are compulsory subjects for 2nd year.

- 3. Printing and Mixed-medium
- 4. Weaving
- 5. Stitching and Knitting

Each subject will be evaluated in 100 marks. Total 500 marks.

Detail mode of study -

1. Alpona and Floor Decoration

Creative/Artistic Importance -

Assessment;
